What they do: The Delaware Animé Society is for those with an interest in Japanese animé (animation), manga (comics), music and pop culture to meet with like-minded people. The group, which welcomes animé fans of all ages, has two chapters, one for southern Delaware, which meets in Dover, and one for northern Delaware, which meets in Bear.

"Some people get into the big robots, some enjoy the love stories or the action," local member Michele Lapinski said of the appeal of animé. "It depends on what you like."

For those who are not full-fledged aficionados, well-known animé titles include Cowboy Bebop, Dragonball, Pokémon, Sailor Moon and Inuyasha; those and some others can be seen on television's Cartoon Network.

DAS meetings, however, provide an opportunity to see harder-to-find titles. "We don't show anything that's on TV," Lapinski said.

When and where they meet: The southern chapter meets from 2 to 8 p.m. the second Saturday of every month at Superior Comics, 121 W. Loockerman St., Dover; their next meeting is Saturday, March 12. Meetings begin with an hour of Dance Dance Revolution and other video games followed by showings of regular series and random picks suggested by members.

The March 12 meeting will include Kodocha, Fruits Basket, Vision of Escaflowne and Full Metal Panic. The showings are appropriate for ages 13 and older; group guidelines decry choices with sexual content or excessive violence.

The society is part of the Animé Advocates program through U.S. distributor ADV Films and receives promo DVDs monthly. They are also on distributor Funimation's mailing list.
